The film is being directed by **Samantha Lang** (My Place, The Monkey's Mask), and produced by **Riccardo Pellizzeri** (Underbelly: NZ, Siege, MDA, Blue Heelers) and **Lara Radulovich** (Wentworth), with the ABC's **Carole Sklan** and **Christopher Gist** as executive producers. Developed by Pellizzeri, Radulovich and Hannam, **Carlotta** is being produced by their new production company Story Ark Productions.

Lara Radulovich and Riccardo Pellizzeri said "This has been a passion project of ours for many years and we are thrilled to be bringing Carlotta's story to the screen. A love story and an outsider tale about an exceptional woman's desire to be ordinary, hers is an extraordinary life, lived in changing times."

Carlotta said "I am absolutely delighted and flattered that this story is being brought to the screen as my main motivation is to show anyone who may be struggling with their gender, or struggling to gain acceptance from their family and society at large - that you can do it. Stand tall, know who you are and be proud of yourself, as acceptance comes from within."

Carole Sklan said, "The ABC has been dramatising stories of remarkable Australians, from Eddie Mabo to Bernie Banton, individuals who have gone against the grain and contributed to social change."

One of the most beautiful women of her generation. But not a woman at all. A film about an extraordinary life lived in changing times.

How many working class Balmain boys grow up to be showgirls? Not just any showgirl but a household name: a legend of Kings Cross, a daytime TV star, and a symbol of generational change. While many know her face, few have heard the real story of Australia's most famous transsexual. Until now.

Long before Australians knew what a transsexual was, Carlotta was pushing the boundaries of gender and sexuality. She was an ambassador for rebellion, freedom, and self-expression: a living, breathing symbol of emerging 60s liberalism. She was a showgirl legend.

Fleeing an abusive stepfather, 16-year-old Richard, a sexually confused innocent, arrived in swinging, "live and let live" Kings Cross. It was 1959 and the nation was waking from a long, conservative slumber. Adopted by a group of like-minded friends, Richard began to test the boundaries of gender and sexuality: to remake himself.

Through cross-dressing and performing, Richard experimented with becoming a woman, and despite persecution and exploitation, found the courage to live as Carol Lee. Later, when illegal hormone treatment had spectacular results, the striking, irrepressible "Carlotta" was born. Fêted, desired and imitated, Carlotta's reign was to endure for three decades.

Distinctly Australian, Carlotta's grit, bawdy glamour, and determination to be the best woman she could be, endeared her to a nation while echoing the desire of a generation of women who also wanted more. Yet it is away from the spotlight that Carlotta played her most important and surprising role.

In the 1980s, a fairytale romance with a "great Aussie bloke" changed everything. The infamous "Carlotta" was consigned to history as Carol fell in love, married, and gave up her stellar career for a life in the suburbs. She reveled in her new life as a homemaker and doting wife with the stable, loving family life she had always craved. But surrounded by reminders of the children she ached for but could never have, Carol found herself stranded between two worlds, belonging in neither. Her new life would test everything she knew about herself, and it would take all her courage to make the heartbreaking sacrifice for the one she loved the most.

Carlotta is the story of an exceptional woman's desire to be ordinary.

Jessica Marais will next be seen in the second season of **Magic City,** opposite Jeffrey Dean Morgan and Olga Kurylenko, for the Starz Network.

Jessica graduated from the National Institute of Dramatic Art (NIDA), Australia's most prestigious acting school, in 2007.

Prior to graduation, she secured a role in her first feature film **Two Fists One Heart** and a leading role in Network Seven's **Packed to the Rafters**, which has now become Australia's highest rating family drama series. Her role as 'Rachel Rafter' on the hit show earned her two Logie Awards in 2009 for *Most Outstanding New Talent* and *Most Popular New Female Talent* as well as a further 3 nominations for *Most Outstanding Actress* and *Most Popular Actress*. In 2011, Jessica was also nominated for

the Gold Logie Award for Most Popular Personality on Australian Television.

Jessica has also appeared in the Australian feature **Needle** and as *Mistress Denna* in the Disney series, **Legend of the Seeker**.

In early 2008, Jessica debuted with the Sydney Theatre Company in the critically acclaimed production of *A Season At Sarsaparilla*.

Alex made his film debut playing the title role in the Australian feature film **The Heartbreak Kid**, directed by Michael Jenkins. This was followed by a brilliant turn as the troubled Ari in **Head On**, directed by Ana Kokkinos, a performance that earned Alex an AFI nomination in 1998 and a Film Critics' Circle of Australia Award in 1999. He also received an AFI nomination in 2001 for his role in the film **La Spagnola**.

Alex has also appeared in the films Three Blind

Mice, Kings Of Mykonos, Summer Coda, Ghost Ship and most recently he completed filming on The Infinite Man.

Alex's Theatre credits include the Griffin Theatre productions of *The Woman with Dog's Eyes, Hurlyburly, The Emperor Of Sydney* and *The Night Watchmen*. Alex appeared on stage in the Ensemble Theatre production of *Rain Man* where he played the title role of Charlie Babbitt.



Since graduating from WAAPA, Damian has appeared in numerous television, film and stage productions.



SAMANTHA LANG DIRECTOR

Samantha Lang is one of Australia's most prolific and awarded directors.

Since graduating with a BA in Directing from the Australian Film and Television School, her career has been punctuated by artistic verve and achievement. Working across a variety of mediums – film, television, theatre and visual arts – Sam has continued to embrace confronting and ambitious material.

In 1997 Sam's debut feature film, **The Well** was nominated for a remarkable eleven Australian Film Institute (AFI) Awards and went on to screen at over 30 festivals worldwide. It was accepted into Official Competition at the 50th Cannes International Film Festival where it was nominated for the prestigious Palme d'Or.

2000's **The Monkey's Mask** was followed by a third feature, **L'Idole** (2003), which she co-wrote with renowned Roman Polanski collaborator Gerard Brach (*Repulsion*, *The Tenant*, *Frantic*). Filmed on location in Paris, the French language picture was released internationally in 2003. Samantha's work is often described as visually sophisticated and she garners warm, natural performances from her cast.

Sam has directed TV campaigns for clients such as Jaguar, Northern Territory Tourism, Caltex, Inghams, Woolworths, Optus and most recently Masterfoods.

In 2004 Samantha made her theatre debut with the confronting play 4:48 Psychosis by the British playwright Sarah Kane which opened to rave reviews at the Stables Theatre.

In association with Australian Theatre for Young People Samantha followed up her commitment to storytelling and community development by conceiving a drama/filmmaking program for indigenous students on Palm Island, Queensland.

Sam continues to develop feature films including *The Jungle*, produced by Amanda Higgs, written by Alice Addison and has just finished a three year stint as Head of Directing at the Australian Film Television and Radio School.

Over a career spanning 30 years, Ric has directed over two hundred hours of drama and produced hundreds of hours of television drama including mini-series, telefilms, series, serials and sitcoms. He has worked on a number of network pilots as well as developing and directing the successful telemovie pilot of **Home and Away** for the Seven Network. Ric has worked in drama development for all three Australian commercial Networks as well as Screentime in New Zealand.

Ric was Supervising Producer of **Blue Heelers** and performed that role for 127 episodes before becoming Executive Producer. Under his guidance **Blue Heelers** became the most watched programme on Australian television winning twenty-two Logies and being nominated fifty times. He was responsible for over 300 hundred episodes and also directed several episodes.

He produced the first series of **MDA** for the ABC and Screentime and was Executive Producer of **Neighbours** and subsequently **Head of Drama** for FremantleMedia Australia. For Fremantle he was Executive Producer of the telefilm **Little Oberon** and developed numerous drama projects.

In 2009/10 Ric produced the UK/NZ film Ice for Screentime in New Zealand, then in 2011 produced the mini series and directed episodes of **Underbelly NZ** - **Land of the Long Green Cloud** for TV3. He also produced the multi award winning telefilm **Siege** for Screentime and TVNZ, as well as directing second unit and script consulting on the TVNZ telemovie **Safe House**.

LARA RADULOVICH PRODUCER

Lara created, developed and script produced the hit drama series **Wentworth** for FOXTEL's SoHo channel. Receiving rave reviews, **Wentworth** is the biggest Australian drama series premiere in Foxtel's history. A re-imagining of iconic Aussie drama *Prisoner*, **Wentworth** is being heralded by critics and audiences alike. **Wentworth** will air on UK's Channel 5 in 2013.

Having commenced her career on the ABC drama **Something In The Air**, Lara has since spent the last eleven years with FremantleMedia Australia in various roles including Drama Producer and Development Executive and Drama Development Producer where she developed, script produced and story produced dramas including **Neighbours**, and **Wentworth**

This year Lara established Story Ark Productions with producer Ric Pellizzari and writer David, Hannam, with **Carlotta** being their first production.

DAVID HANNAM WRITER

David Hannam has written, story edited or script edited series drama for all three commercial networks, FOXTEL, and ABC TV.

His credits include Winners and Losers, Bed of Roses, Last Man Standing, Neighbours, All Saints, Stingers, Always Greener, Something in the Air and numerous high-end international dramas for children, including Lightning Point and Dance Academy.

David graduated from the University of South Australia with a journalism degree, and worked extensively for ABC TV as a reporter and producer in news and current affairs, and later arts and entertainment.

TOBY OLIVER ACS

DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY

Multi award winning cinematographer, Toby Oliver ACS is internationally renown for his work across feature films, prime-time television drama and short films through to documentaries and TV commercials.

A graduate of Melbourne's renowned Swinburne Film School in 1988, Toby has created some remarkable film images, from the 'beautifully lit' gritty black and white of his first feature **Everynight... Everynight** (ACS Silver Award) to the box-office hit teen movie and AFI winning **Looking For Alibrandi** (ACS Silver Award, AFI and IF Award nominations) directed by Kate Woods and starring Anthony LaPaglia and Greta Scacchi; and the 'painterly approach' of **Tom White** (ACS Gold Award, AFI and IF Award nominations). His work on short films, documentaries and features has been seen at major festivals around the world, including Venice, Sundance, Sydney, Melbourne, Busan, Montreal, Tokyo and Toronto.

In 2010 Toby was again nominated for an AFI for the 'landmark achievement' World War 1 action drama Beneath Hill 60 (ACS Gold Award, AFI nomination) directed by Jeremy Sims, and received the AFI for the dramatised documentary Miracle In The Storm (ACS Gold Award) for ABC TV. Other feature films include the Chinese-Australian co-production 33 Postcards (ACS Bronze Award) directed by Pauline Chan and starring Guy Pearce, festival favourite Last Train To Freo; controversial gang picture The Combination (ACS Silver Award for Cinematography); the acclaimed feature documentary Forbidden Lie\$; Chinese hit film Waiting Alone and the 3D documentary Cane Toads The Conquest.

His television credits include the critically acclaimed ABC miniseries **Devil's Dust**; ratingswinning TV movie **Beaconsfield** (ACS Gold Award) directed by Glendyn Ivin for the Nine Network; **Spirited – Season 2** for FOXTEL (ACS Bronze Award); series 2 of **Stupid Stupid Man**; Series 1 of **Lockie Leonard**; **Dossa And Joe** for the BBC; **SHORT CUTS** for Disney UK and **Love Is A Four Letter Word** for ABC TV.

To date Toby has received three AFI Award nominations and one AFI Award, two IF Award nominations and two FCCA Award nominations for his cinematography. His work has been judged by his peers for a number of Gold, Silver and Bronze Awards from the Australian Cinematographers Society (ACS), including the Golden Tripod Award for **Tom White** in 2005, and the Best in Show Award for **Beaconsfield** in 2012.

His most recent project was the sequel **Wolf Creek 2** (2013), directed by Greg Mclean, and slated for 2013 Toby also has the gangster crime thriller **The Albanian** to be directed by long-time collaborator Alkinos Tsilimidos across four countries.

MURRAY PICKNETT

PRODUCTION DESIGNER

Murray Picknett worked originally at the BBC and then the ABC, where he designed many mini series, including the seminal **Blue Murder**.

Later as a freelancer, he designed nine feature films, among them **Risk**, **Black and White** and **The Final Winter**. For his work on **Passion**, the film about the composer Percy Grainger, he was awarded an AFI Award and a second AFI for the tap dancing steelworker film **Bootmen**.

Along with her many Australian Make Up Industry Awards for her work on feature films and television including **Jessica** and **Mary Bryant** Deborah is also an Emmy Award nominated make up artist for her many brilliant *looks* on Deborah Messing in the US series **The Starter Wife.**

Throughout her career Deborah has designed make up for great actors including Denzel Washington, Emma Thompson, Glenn Close, Simon Baker, Rose Byrne, Rebecca Gibney, Harry Connick Jr. and Melanie Griffith to name a few.

She has also designed make up and hair for over 25 high profile Australian television series, telemovies and feature films and has made up most of the familiar faces we see on screen today.
